The 'balloon went up' with a hearty supper provided by Wright Caterers and organised by Anne Gains. Our guest pianist, Brian Budden played a medley of tunes whilst we ate and also accompanied several of the acts. Norman Bartlett was our enthusiastic Master of Ceremonies who organised and introduced everyone.

The Twinning Choir, supported by several members of the 'Village Voices Choir', helped to launch the concert by singing three songs from their 1940s' repertoire (see below).

This was followed by Judi Milburn demonstrating the 'Charleston' (photo right) before inviting members of the audience to take part. Next, Alan Borrow with Diana Coggswell as 'Cinderella' and

To cheer us all up, John Gains and I sang 'We're a couple of swells,' who walked up' The Avenue' to have tea with the Vanderbilts.


Alan Borrow then entertained us with his version of 'The Wreck of the Hesperus' accompanied by a variety of hats, which again caused great hilarity!
