Autumn Event on 23 September 2016 at St James' Hall

The Chinese Workers' Auction was devised by troops based in Malaya where poor Chinese peasants made up some of the work force. They didn't have much money, but were always able to find a couple of cents in their pockets, so the soldiers supplemented their 'cents' with items to make an 'auction' where everyone could afford to buy something.

Please search your lofts and garages and donate your 'auction' items in advance of our Chinese Workers' Auction on September 23. You do not have to pay the actual amount the item the Auctioneer will suggest, but you will need to come armed with lots of loose change and £1 and £2 pound coins, as well as £5 notes.

The bidding will go something like this:
'I have here a very special child's bike
which belonged to none other than Prince
William of Wales! I am opening the bidding

at £20......'Who will bid £22 for this item?' (This is £2 on top of the opening bid so £2 will be placed on the plate.)
The Auctioneer will continue.....'
'Who will bid £24?'

(This is another £2 increase, so another £2 will be placed on the plate). The Auctioneer will sense the enthusiasm for the item and may decide to reduce the bidding to £1 increases

or even less – only the increased amount will be put on the plate. When no more people want to increase the bid, the item will be 'sold' to the final bidder, who may only have to put 50p on the plate to get the item. The Twinning Association, meanwhile, pockets all the cash and for the child's bike we may have made perhaps £8 to £10, whilst the final bidder has got a child's bike for maybe as little as 50p!

The more items we have, the more profit we will make, especially if you bring along your friends and relatives and encourage them to bring a load of loose change!

There will be a ploughman's supper included in the price and please bring your own wine and glasses. A Booking Form with further details will be sent out to you after our Committee Meeting on September 8.

FUTURE EVENTS FOR 2016/2017:

We have a provisional date of 12 November 2016 for a 'French Evening' – a supper of bread, with French cheeses and wine.

Emsworth Sailing Club will be approached with a view to holding an Annual Dinner there in late January/early February 2017. This will depend on take up, as for the last two years we have had to cancel due to low numbers.
